FAQ for parents and caregivers

What is an MC3 Huddle?

An MC3 Huddle is a collaborative discussion on how to best support your child in the school setting.

Michigan Clinical Consultation & Care (MC3), a Michigan Medicine program, coordinates this virtual meeting with your school-based mental health professional, your child's primary care physician or other treating provider, and an MC3 consulting specialist, which includes child and adolescent psychiatrists, psychologists, and social workers. Together, the group will discuss your child's specific needs, ideas for support, and any relevant community resources.

Why is this Huddle happening?

This Huddle was requested by either your school or your treating health care provider so that they can collaborate and receive guidance and resources to support your child.

Do I attend the Huddle?

No, you and your child do not attend the Huddle. However, the outcome of the discussion will be shared with you, especially if there are recommendations made to support your child.

What do I need to do?

Please complete the **Release of Information** form provided to you. The Huddle will not be scheduled until you have given consent for communication by signing and returning the form.

Is there a cost?

No, there is no cost to you or the schools for MC3 Huddles. MC3 is a grant-funded program that provides consultation and education to schools and health care providers.
